This is not only heritage by Méta-Morphosis

As of April 1, 2016, Sofitel Brussels Le Louise is delighted to host a new exhibition entitled "This is not only heritage" by Méta-Morphosis, organized in collaboration with "Mazel Galerie".

Axel Ruhomaully and Franck Depaifve, Belgian artists, were accustomed to palaces and luxury settings but in 2015 they were seduced by the poetry of an old coal mine. Heavy industry rapidly became their new playground. In 2015, they created Meta-Morphosis with one goal: to save the beauty of industrial wasteland and to transmit the memory of the former workers.

Their project essentially involves photographs and is organized around four axes: heroes, accessories, logos, and settings. "This is not only heritage" is notably supported by the UNESCO, Google and the Brussels Region.

The exhibition at Sofitel Brussels Le Louise focuses on the symbolic accessories from a deserted universe at the mercy of time. The pictures exposed in the hotel lobby as well as in the Crystal Lounge Restaurant trace the history of the machinery and tools of those days.

“Achieving an aesthetic poetry of a forsaken place and allowing the world to discover it”: this is the objective of Méta-Morphosis through this emotionally moving exhibition.

Because this exhibition is above all the story of an encounter between two artists, a visionary gallery and a hotel brand committed to contemporary art, it seemed logical to celebrate this collaboration with an exceptional **private viewing**. This will take place on **Thursday, 14 April from 6.30 p.m.** (reservation mandatory). The objective is to exchange about artistic sensibilities, and prove that a hotel can be a place of memory transmission and patrimony.

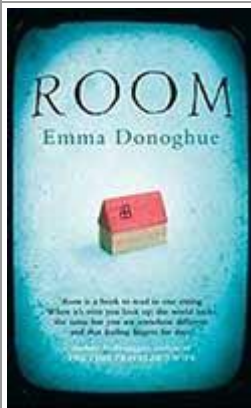

by Emma Donoghue (Ireland-Canada)

Emma Donoghue is an Irish-Canadian playwright, literary historian, novelist and screenwriter. She was born in Dublin, Ireland, received her PhD from the University of Cambridge and finally settled in London, Ontario. From age 23, she earned her living as a writer.

Her 2010 novel "ROOM" was a finalist for the Man Booker Prize and an international best-seller. It is the story of a five-year-old called Jack, who lives in a single room with his Ma and has never been outside. When he turns five, he starts asking questions, and his mother reveals to him that there is a world beyond the walls. Told entirely in Jack's voice, ROOM is no horror story or tearjerker, but a celebration of resilience and the love between parent and child.

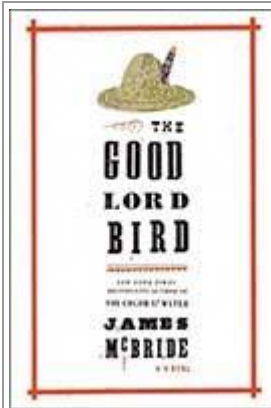
The Dice Man

by James McBride (USA)

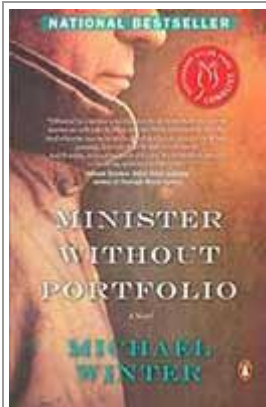
James McBride was born in Brooklyn - U.S. He is an accomplished musician (saxophone) and a journalist.

A Guided Visit to the van Doesburg Exhibition



Join us on Saturday, April 30, for a guided visit of the van Doesburg exhibition, one of this year's Europalia activities.

Travel back to the beginning of the twentieth century with Theo van Doesburg and inhale the revolutionary atmosphere of the avant-garde in the exhibition *Theo van Doesburg: A New Expression of Life, Art and Technology*. Having founded the art movement De Stijl in the Netherlands with Piet Mondrian in 1917, van Doesburg set off across Europe to promote their abstract visual language internationally. In Paris, he encountered the art of the Dadaists and began writing Dadaist poetry himself. In Weimar, he presented his new awareness of beauty to the Bauhaus architects. He travelled around Europe and made his pioneering visual language appear not only in paintings, but also in buildings, furniture and interiors.
